II. COURSE DESCRIPTION

COUN5503 Solomonian Transformative Counseling Principles (Counseling from Proverbs) is a graduate level analysis of Solomonian worldview foundations and applications presented in the Book of Proverbs. The course considers counseling needs and Solomonian wisdom in the areas of (1) identity, purpose, and priorities, (2) depression and anxiety, (3) pre-marital and marital, (4) parental and family, (5) financial and stewardship, (6) addiction, (7) abuse and trauma, and (8) conflict counseling. The course is designed to help transformative counsellors to draw counseling structure and content from Solomon's writings, and to provide a basic guide for dealing with common challenges faced by counselees.

III. LEARNING OUTCOMES

Course Learning Outcomes (CLOs)

1. To be able to determine through exegetical analysis a textually justified approach to addressing common counseling needs and with solutions from Solomonian literature.
2. To be able to classify common counseling needs, including: (1) identity, purpose, and priorities, (2) depression and anxiety, (3) pre-marital and marital, (4) parental and family, (5) financial and stewardship, (6) addiction, (7) abuse and trauma, and (8) conflict counseling.
3. Through the skills developed in addressing the Book of Proverbs, to be able to demonstrate skill in exegetical analysis to draw out counseling principles and practice from transformative literature.

VII. Assignments and Grading Rubric (1000 Points)

1. Module Assessment (20 points each x 10) 200 Points (Video Presentations)
 - a. CLO 3 / PLO 3,4 / ALO 1,2
 - b. Instructions: Learners will submit a 10-15 minute video presentation summarizing the content of each module (10 total videos)
2. Course Content Assessment 200 Points (Short Essay Exam)
 - a. CLO 2 / PLO 3,4 / ALO 3,5
 - b. Instructions: Learners will choose a Discussion Question from any module, and address the topic/question in roughly 3000 words. (1 essay).
3. Interaction Assessment 200 Points (Discussion Board)
 - a. CLO 2 / PLO 3,4 / ALO 2
 - b. Instructions: Learners will post in the discussion board a substantive post answering the discussion topic in each module, and will respond to at least two other posts by Learners/Faculty in the module.
4. Reading Content Assessment 200 Points (Reviews and Critiques)
 - a. CLO 1 / PLO 3,4 / ALO 1,2
 - b. Instructions: Learners will write a 1000-1500 word review and critique on each module's assigned readings (one overall review per module). Learners should summarize the material and offer some critique or poignant analysis.
5. Competency Assessment 200 points
 - a. CLO 3 / PLO 1,2 / ALO 4,5

- b. Instructions: Learners will select and complete any 1 of the 3 competency assignments. Specifics of the assessment *must* be preapproved by the mentoring professor:
- i. Civic Engagement Component – a practical social engagement of 3-6 hours applying principles covered in the course, and a 2000-word report discussing: (1) Introduction of the Engagement, (2) Methodology, (3) Summary of What Happened, and (4) Benefits and Implications
 - ii. Journal Article Component – a journal article quality paper of 8000-10000 words on an approved topic related to the course material, to be submitted to a relevant academic journal (Style determined by the journal of submittal).
 - iii. Teaching Encounter Component – preparing, delivering, recording, and submitting a 60-90 minute teaching to a live audience on an approved topic related to the course material
